She was healed of lung cancer on the last day of Divine Healing Seminar with John and Ellen Duncan in Fortaleza-Brazil. She felt at the time the disease had left her body, but waited to do the tests again to make sure of the healing. A month later doctors did all the tests again and were surprised when they saw that there was no cancer. There was a commotion at the hospital because the doctors said there was a miracle. In August, the doctors had given her only four months to live. A doctor visited her at her own house when he heard about it to see if it was the same Iracema... And did not understand when he saw there was no sign of cancer. Sister Iracema is the mother of one of our pastors, Pastor Abelardo from Jardim Jatoba-Fortaleza."

Other Trip Costs:

1. Airfare to Fortaleza, Brazil... Each person will be responsible for purchasing their own airplane ticket. This can cost anywhere from around \$800 to \$1,500, depending on how and when you purchase the ticket. You may want to check with your Frequent Flier Miles or your credit card's Rewards Program, as you may qualify for a good discount or even a free ticket if you have accumulated enough points.

2. Valid Passport and Brazilian TOURIST Visa*... If you do not have a valid passport AND a valid Brazilian Visa, you must get both of these done. The first step is to get the passport, then you must get that passport to a Brazilian consulate to obtain the visa. We would advise you to start this process several months before the trip as it usually takes several weeks to get this done.

*Please be sure to have an application turned in and **approved** before you get your Tourist Visa. Application papers to be posted by the end of August 2011.

- Please note that you should not seek for a "missionary visa." These are only for people who are moving / working in the country as full-time missionaries. Any short-term missions trip qualifies as a tourist trip. Please obtain a TOURIST visa.
